

What Does the Global Methodist Church Believe?

It's hard to believe, but we have been a Global Methodist Church for over two years now. When we disaffiliated from the UMC and decided to join the GMC there were concerns and questions about how our beliefs would change. It bears repeating that the Doctrines of the Global Methodist Church are taken directly from classic Wesleyan doctrines and sources of authority, namely what is known as the Articles of Religion, and John Wesley's sermons.



One of the aims of the GMC is to be accountable to the doctrine, not as some historic theory, but in actuality, as a vision and rule for faith and practice. This was the main argument with our former denomination, that though the doctrine (at that time) was historic Wesleyan doctrine and polity, there was no longer meaningful accountability to the doctrine throughout the leadership and life of the church.

We are Christians first and foremost. Our denominational status is of secondary importance. But that's not *no importance*. Our Methodist theology is scriptural and vital and continues to have resonance and power. In the United States to-day much of Mainline Protestantism is in decline. The rest of the Church outside of Catholicism has more in common with Baptist theology than any other. Many nondenominational churches are *Baptist-ish*. There are churches that fit under the Reformed label that are not Baptist but in some ways have more in common with Baptists than Methodists. Let me say that I think Baptists and Reformed churches have made and will continue to make great contributions to Christianity and the Kingdom of God. *(cont. pg. 2)*

But I believe their theology, and by extension their witness, is incomplete. There are things that Wesleyans believe and do that are vitally needed today. John Wesley was one of the world's great reformers. The Methodist movement began as a reforming movement in the Anglican Church of England. The Church of today still needs reformation.

I am saying God is not done with the Methodist movement or the people called Methodist!

Many of you were not raised Methodist and, *hey, that's okay.* We know you have questions about what we believe here at Hicks Church. We thought it would be worthwhile to do a teaching series in our worship on The Doctrines of the Global Methodist Church. We will cover some important topics. We won't address everything, but we hope it will prompt reflection and a hunger to know God and serve Him. See you in worship.
