

Romans

"Paul's letter to the Romans is a kind of Christian manifesto. . .a manifesto of freedom through Jesus Christ. It is the fullest, plainest and grandest statement of the gospel in the New Testament. Its message is. . .that human beings are born in sin and slavery, but that Jesus Christ came to set us free."

John Stott, Romans

There is nothing like Romans. It is majestic and poetic in one moment and in the next it hits in the gut with its insight and practicality. Its impact on the church and world history cannot be overstated. It was Romans that convicted and moved Martin Luther to proclaim that we are justified by grace through faith in Christ. This doctrine was the trumpet of call of the Reformation. For this reason, among others, William Barclay says there is no Protestant theology (or Protestant Church) without the letter to the Romans.

Romans fueled the Reformation in direct line from Luther to Calvin and Zwingli. Romans also played a significant role in the life of a later Reformer by the name of John Wesley. Wesley and his brother, Charles, had been religious young men and engaged in impressive activities of study and piety. But John's heart (and soul?) remained restless and doubting, even as he continued to do missionary work for the Lord. He was in London one May day in 1738. He had just returned from a mission trip to Georgia, which he felt a failure. That evening he went to a Moravian (church) meeting on Aldersgate Street. He later wrote in his journal that he went "very unwillingly". Someone was reading Luther's preface (yes, that Luther) to the Romans. (continued page 2) Then this happened:

At about a quarter before nine, when he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death.

John Wesley was changed forever and the Methodist movement was born. Such was the power of the letter to the Romans that by *merely reading an introductory preface* a man's life was changed. We Methodists owe a great deal to Romans.

In April and May we are going to teach from this "manifesto of freedom through Christ." There is so much to learn, so much information to gain. But more than that, my prayer is that God would move our hearts and souls to salvation, reformation, and revival as He has done so often before.

Make it an appointment with God to be in worship to learn from this letter. Whether you come eagerly, or "very unwillingly" – doesn't matter – just come.
